The Machinists Union District Lodge 751, representing thousands of workers in our local community, is also involved in a charity started by a Machinist, Guide Dogs of America. These guide dogs are bred at the Guide Dogs headquarters near Los Angeles, California. They provide a great service to our visually impaired citizens, friends and neighbors in the State of Washington. As one local recipient said, "My guide dog helped lead me out of the darkness."

This program was started in 1948 by a Machinist Union member who had sight impairment himself. Today, this successful program helps almost 60 visually impaired individuals each year. However, for this program to be successful, we need your contribution. It costs over \$48,000 per team starting with the initial breeding and two years of training of the dogs. Likewise, the recipient is matched to the dog, receives 3 weeks on-site training and provided with follow-up after a successful match.

Your contribution will help us to provide guide dogs free of charge to our visually impaired citizens, friends and neighbors. These guide dogs help men and women reach their dreams and goals successfully and allows them to participate in their community. Guide dogs not only provide the gift of increased independence, confidence and mobility, but they also act as a trusted companion providing new opportunities for social interaction.

We are reaching out to you because we know you care about a better quality of life for members of our community. Help us make a difference for visually impaired men and women by supporting Guide Dogs of America.
