

# The New River

At 350 million years old isn't "new" at all, is credited with playing a large hand in the town's rapid early settlement and is enjoyed by mountain natives and visitors alike! The New River is one of the few major rivers in the world which flows south to north and boasts the title of one of the oldest rivers in the world, second only to the Nile River, which also flows south to north. The New River is great for boating, swimming, fishing, nature viewing and its uncommonly clear water is perfect for snorkeling.

# Blue Ridge Parkway

A National Parkway and All-American Road in the United States, noted for its scenic beauty. It runs for 469 miles (755 km), mostly along the famous Blue Ridge, a major mountain chain that is part of the Appalachian Mountains. Its southern terminus is on the boundary between Great Smoky Mountains National Park and the Cherokee Indian Reservation in North Carolina, from which it travels north to Shenandoah National Park in Virginia and offers access to the Skyline Drive, the major north/south artery through the Park. The two All-American Byways are separate and distinct. The Blue Ridge Parkway was built to connect Shenandoah National Park to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

For overnight or extended visits, hiking, camping, health services and necessary amenities are available in the towns of Elkin-Jonesville & Sparta, North Carolina, Independence & Wytheville, Virginia. Visit our unique local dining, motels, bed & breakfast and vacation homes.

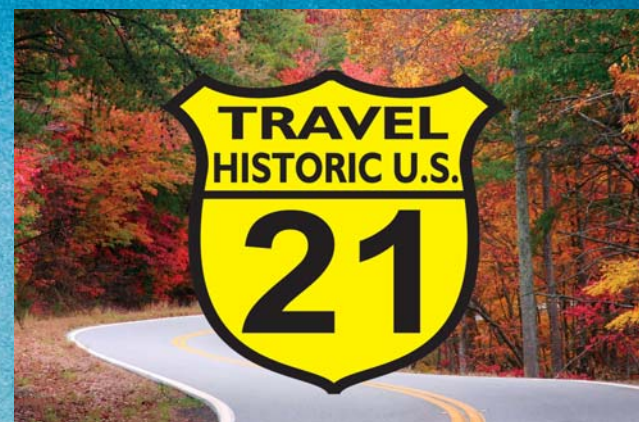

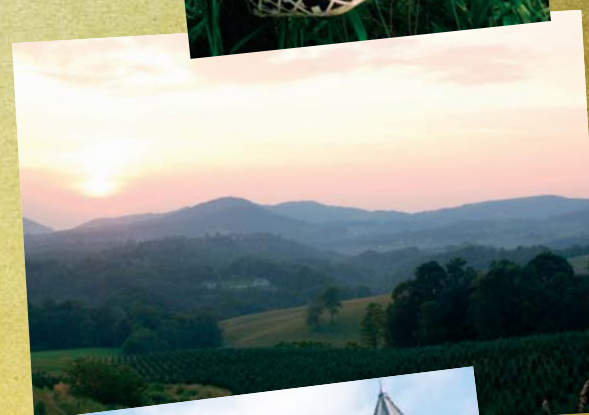
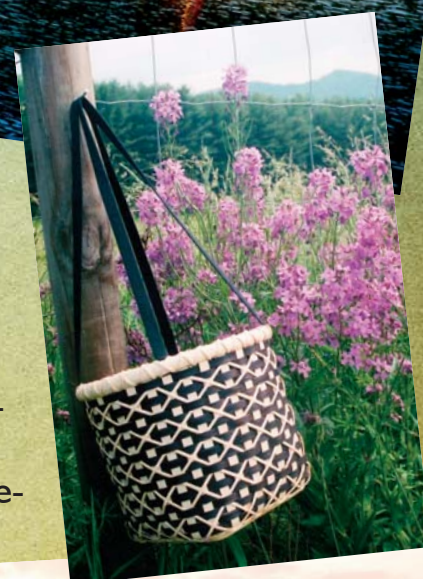

## Elkin, NC

Elkin is the geographic center of the gorgeous Yadkin Valley located in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. Listed on the national Register of Historic Places, Elkin is known for its charm and friendly faces. Unique shopping, restaurants and plenty of local wineries make up Elkin's bustling downtown.

The Elkin area offers some of the best places to bike, hike and drive to see the color display. The Blue Ridge Parkway, considered the nation's most scenic byway, draws thousands of visitors to our region each year. ## Roaring Gap, NC

A picturesque resort community, established in 1890 as a summer resort is located on the continental divide. Roaring Gap derives its name from the noise the wind makes when rushing through mountains in the area. 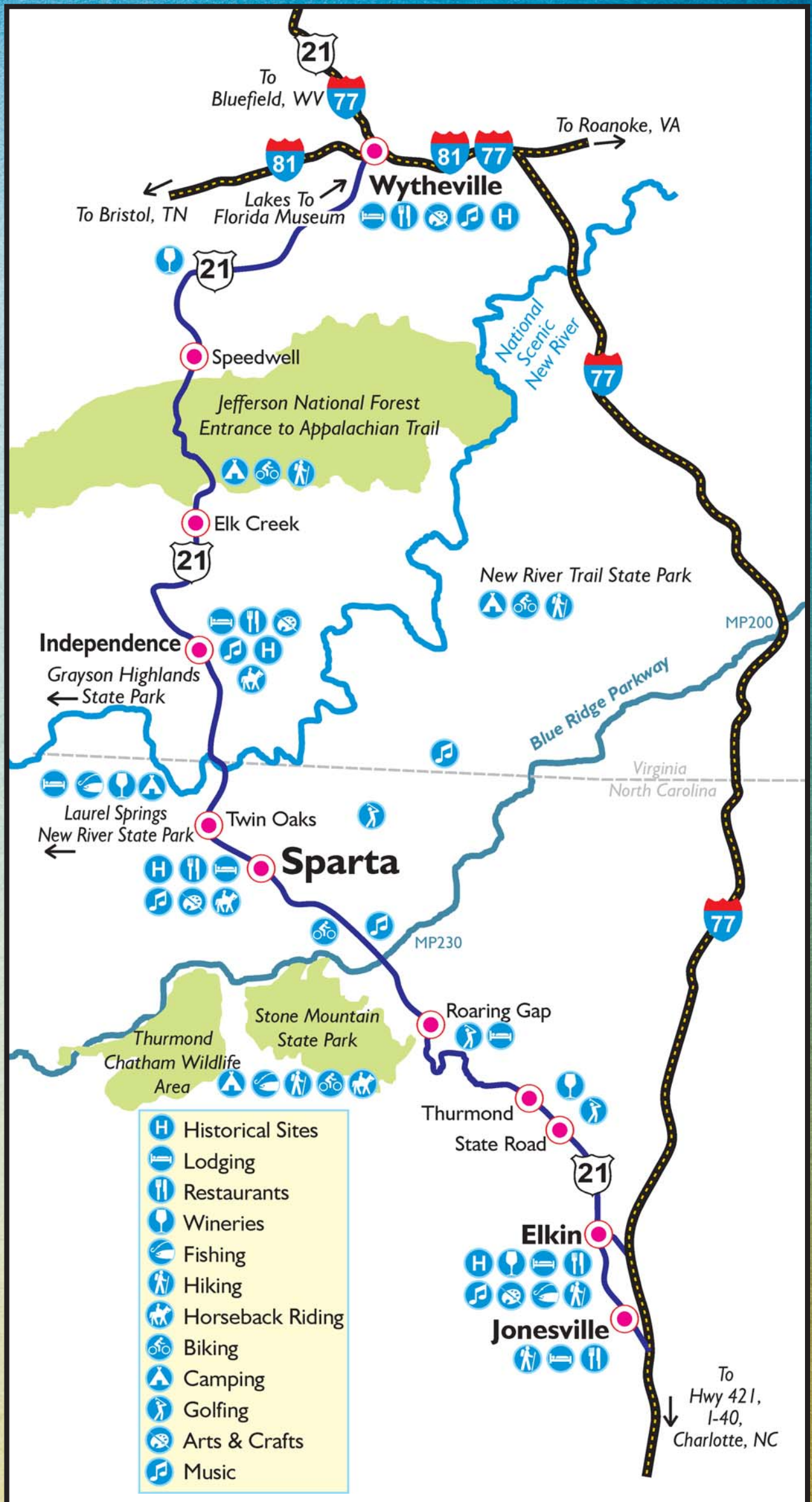
## Sparta, NC
